In Christ we are one and inseparable

As I bid farewell to Warwick, my heart brims with gratitude. Over the past two weeks, I've been deeply moved by the overwhelming outpouring of appreciation from parishioners, the school community, and the people I've encountered here. It's been a challenge to fully absorb it all. I feel truly blessed and greatly encouraged to continue serving the people of God with even greater zeal.

The Catholic community of Warwick has exemplified acceptance, warmth, and inclusivity to me. In this Sunday's gospel, we're reminded of Jesus healing the leper, a person shunned by society due to their condition. We've all experienced the impact of social isolation and quarantine during the COVID-19 lockdowns and understand the trauma it brings.

Beyond the physical healing, what resonates with me is Jesus' desire for the leper to reintegrate into society, to resume normalcy in relationships and connections. Imagine the joy and relief the leper must have felt, returning to friends, family, and acquaintances. I see in Jesus both vulnerability and eagerness for the leper's swift return to social life, urging him to seek approval from the authorities.

Our faith in Christ unites us in a community not defined by caste, colour, ethnicity, or language, but rooted solely in Christ, our Lord and Savior, where we are all brothers and sisters, calling God our father. Warwick, thank you for reaffirming this truth for me. Through Christ, I am one with you, and you have embraced me fully because of Him. Everything we are stems from Him, and nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God in Christ.

And as I leave you for a short time (however long that can be), I REMEMBER you all. This poem from Joy Harjo, a native American helps us all to be grateful and connected.

Remember the sky that you were born under, know each of the star's stories. Remember the moon, know who she is.

Remember the sun's birth at dawn, that is the strongest point of time.

Remember sundown and the giving away to night.

Remember your birth, how your mother struggled to give you form and breath.

You are evidence of her life, and her mother's, and hers.

Remember your father. He is your life, also.

Remember the earth whose skin you are red earth, black earth, yellow earth, white earth brown earth, we are earth.

Remember the plants, trees, animal life who all have their tribes, their families, their histories, too.

Talk to them, listen to them. They are alive poems.

Remember the wind. Remember her voice. She knows the origin of this universe.

Remember you are all people, and all people are you.

Remember you are this universe, and this universe is you.

Remember all is in motion, is growing, is you.

Remember language comes from this. Remember the dance language is, that life is. Remember.
