Echoes of Calvary: Reflection on the last seven words of Jesus on the cross. "I thirst" (John 19: 28)

"Sometimes the desire to be lost again, as long ago, comes over me like a vapour", writes my beloved poet Mary Oliver. She is verbalizing a desire in all of us to be lost once again. Her words resonate with a universal longing to reclaim a sense of being lost. This yearning isn't exclusive to her alone; it's a sentiment shared by many. In a world inundated with noise, opinions, reels, newsfeeds and responsibilities, the longing to escape and find solitude is a natural response. This yearning, this longing, is intrinsic to the human experience. While some may try to ignore or distract themselves from it, this longing catalyzes our passion, our hope, and our drive.

Although the lived experience of this longing often appears as emptiness, homesickness, sadness, or a sense of incompleteness, it holds a sacred significance—a divine grip cast upon us by God. God is the Supreme beauty, truth, and goodness, alluring us to him with a persistent yearning for more in our everyday encounters. The thirst of Jesus on the cross shows the passion he carries for our salvation and communion with the Father. Even in the face of apparent failure on the cross, Jesus still hopes, dreams and thirst. Perhaps it is here that the notion crystallizes: death is not an end, but rather a step closer to the ultimate union with supreme beauty, truth, and goodness we have been searching for all our lives.

Living alone in Goondiwindi at the presbytery, this longing resonates more loudly within me. Despite moments of profound ministry or cherished friendships, there are times when I still feel a lingering sense of emptiness. This sensation isn't unique to me; it can affect anyone, even those in seemingly happy marriages. I have heard of priests attempting to numb this emptiness with alcohol, gambling, relationships etc. Maybe I numb or distract it with the gym, Netflix, a good curry etc. As I grow older, what makes me non-anxious about this "thirst" is the conviction and acceptance that it is not a negative experience but rather a positive affirmation that I am created for something beyond material fulfilment.

My challenge is to create space for this 'yearning' to surface and embrace it courageously. Whenever I do that, it is a beautiful spiritual experience that generates hope and energy. Jesus' public outcry of "I thirst" is a humble acknowledgement of his desire for union with his father and the Holy Spirit. Mary Oliver writes, "Another morning and I wake with thirst for the goodness I do not have". St. Augustine writes in his Confessions, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord and our hearts are restless until they rest in You." This humble acceptance keeps the yearning a divine affair and saves it from the clutches of materialism and capitalism.

Let us not shrug away from this *divine grip* – yearning-through distractions. Let us wake up each morning with humble submission that I thirst for the goodness, beauty, and truth I do not have. FrB.
