Echoes of Calvary: a reflection on the final seven words of Jesus

"He said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother."

Imagine a condition that makes a person irritable, depressed, and self-centred, and is associated with a 26% increase in the risk of premature mortality. Imagine too that in industrialised countries around a third of people are affected by this condition, with one person in 12 affected severely, and that these proportions are increasing. Income, education, sex, and ethnicity are not protected, and the condition is contagious. The effects of the condition are not attributable only to certain people, but it affects everyone irrespective of differences. And that condition is loneliness.

The book of Genesis portrays a confession from God at the very beginning of creation, "it is not good for the human person to be alone, I will give a partner to him". We are created never to be alone, and our creator does not want us to be alone. At the foot of the cross, there is Mary, who has no one except her son who is dying right in front of her. Then there is John who has everyone but have left by everyone including his fellow disciples. Jesus, bringing them together and giving them to each other. Jesus creates a new community that is not related because of blood, colour, ethnicity, education, profession or sports but because of the faith in God.

This message is at the heart of the Gospel- adoption. God so loved the world that he gave his only son to save the world. And what is salvation? Anyone who receives Jesus as saviour, the Holy Spirit help them to become children of God who are born not of flesh but by the will of God. God adopts each one of us into a family. In the community of faith, we are never alone.

When I left Warwick, at least 15 families told me that I have always a room in their house and pop in at any time (the bravest people of the century). Barry Scanlan told me that he likes to see me around his house any time. I took it up a few times. Imagine the scene: he and Pat walk in, find this little Indian squeezed into a couch as tall as him and suddenly it's a party! Yes, it happened a few times. Wow, how can I be lonely when I have people like that around me? I may be houseless, but I am never homeless or lonely. And all because of my faith, nothing but the faith in Jesus of Barry, Pat, you and me.

The words of Jesus from the cross invite us to adopt, adopt, and adopt. Adopt each other, adopt the stranger, adopt the seasonal worker, adopt the homeless, adopt the one who struggles with dementia, adopt the new person who came to the church for the first time, adopt the friend who just lost his wife, adopt the neighbour who just moved to the nursing home, adopt the family who just lost their daughter, adopt the lonely soul who drinks alone at the pub. Adopt- Woman, I am your son. Son, I am your mother.

As Catholics, we can never be lonely because we believe in a sacramental world. The grace of God flows through the world around us and the Holy Spirit is our constant companion. How could we ever feel truly alone? As Mary Oliver writes, whoever you are, no matter how lonely, the world offers itself to your imagination. God never strips us of the creation that surrounds us. There is always a sky, the birds who sing, the gum trees that squeak, the roos that hop. And through it all, the Holy Spirit whispers, "I will never leave you orphan."


