Testimony: the Language of Resurrection

Mary and the disciples went through a harrowing week filled with intense agony. It was indeed traumatic for them. They witnessed the schemes of the temple authority to execute Jesus, his dramatic arrest in front of them, the subsequent public trial, persecution, whipping, stripping, and ultimate public humiliation leading to the excruciating form of death. They were present throughout, witnessing and personally experiencing every moment of it.

Mary and the disciples were deeply affected by trauma, an enduring suffering that lingers. Following Jesus's burial, they faced the daunting task of reorienting themselves amidst the aftermath of the devastating events that shattered their understanding and trust. Their experience mirrors that of individuals, families, and communities grappling with tragedies such as bushfires, floods, or war, all of whom are compelled to undergo a process of reorientation.

For Mary and the disciples, the trial, persecution, and crucifixion pushed them beyond the brink of what seemed conceivable or manageable. Yet, contrary to conventional psychological theories of trauma, within a mere three days, Mary and the disciples, who had initially secluded themselves out of fear, emerged filled with joy and renewed purpose. Praise the Lord, that instead of transmitting intergenerational trauma, Mary and disciples pass on intergenerational joy and courage. And there is only one explanation for it: they encountered the Risen Jesus. They witnessed the traumatic death of Jesus, and they should be scarred for life. But the Gospel says otherwise. With the resurrection, their whole knowledge system collapses, and straightforward communication stumbles. They are witnessing the Holy Spirit at work. Human reasoning ends and divine logic takes over.

How do they articulate this experience? I would say, if the Greeks invented tragedy, the Romans the epistle, the Persians the Gathas (short hymns), Indian Hindus the Sutras, the Holy Spirit gave the Christians a new method speak of resurrection, that of testimony and witnessing. This testimony of the risen Christ and witnessing to his transforming power is accompanied by joy, vitality, powerful manifestation of the working of the Holy Spirit and a strong sense of community and love for each other.

This is the gift of the resurrection of Jesus: when we accept Jesus as Lord and Saviour, we are given the power to witness Jesus through our preaching and through our way of life. We, Christians, are not survivors, but conquerors. For us, the boundary between life and death is none because as St. Paul says, whether we live or die we are with Christ. The person who is not afraid of death, is dangerous, passionate, committed, joyful and full of the Holy Spirit of love and life.

Resurrection is the day of the Holy Spirit; the spirit who brings order out of chaos and turns death into life. As we sing easter halleluiah, let us be reminded that when we were baptized, we were baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus. Therefore, we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead.

So let our easter prayer be: Holy Spirit given to me in baptism, confirmation, eucharist and sacrament of marriage, I give you permission to be fully released in me. And I may witness to the power and joy of risen Jesus in my thoughts, words, and actions. Amen.

Happy Easter everyone. I miss you all very dearly.
