### Remain with me

And on the 21st day, the chick begins to break out of the shell. Using its egg tooth, it first pecks a hole through the shell. Then it pecks a circle around the end of the egg. The chick twists its neck pushes with its feet and breaks the shell open... and the hatching comes to an end. It was indeed a fascinating thing for me to watch my mum picking a hen, arranging a clay pot with straws and eggs and letting the hen sit on it. It was an anxious wait for me and my sister Sony. Curiosity was at its peak. What would happen to the eggs when the hen sat on then? Would it really become warm? Why did the hen become so cranky when I was trying to get close to the eggs? And on the 21st day, all questions were finally answered.

As I was praying our Sunday reading, this imagery of hatching emerged in me. In the Gospel for this Sunday, we hear Jesus asking his disciples "to abide with him". Another translation says, "Remain with me". We also hear Jesus inviting us "to make your home in me, as I make my home in you". In my style, Jesus says, "bro, come let's hatch". The image of the hen settling up on eggs is so vivid in me. The hen slowly steps into the clay pot with eggs. She sits on them adjusting herself gently. Then using her pecks, she nudges the eggs closer to her, making sure all the eggs are under her. Then she gently closes her eyes, and then swiftly open, close, half open and again close and this way she stays on the eggs, hatches...

This is Jesus' invitation for us - to be with Him. It involves finding time, adjusting ourselves, settling into His presence, and making our home in Him as He makes His in us. Just as branches remain close to the vine, bearing fruit, our Christian life of love results from our prayer life. The warmth and closeness we experience from spending time with Christ in prayer flow out of us in our actions. As we read in our second reading for this Sunday, our love is not merely words or talk, but something real and active.

As parishioners who regularly attend Mass and engage in spiritual formation, we carry a lot of potential. When we allow the warmth of the Holy Spirit to embrace our potential, we begin to imagine and be creative. This is my experience. Every time I allow myself to settle into God's presence and seek Him in prayer, the Holy Spirit, like a proud hen, begins to sit on me, hatching those potentials into actuality. Making a home in God through prayer is never a waste of time. The all-encompassing grace of God seeps into us as we open ourselves up to His presence. May the habit of prayer increase in us. May the fruits of our prayer life flow out into our families, relationships, workplaces, and beyond.

**Postscript:** Recently, I was feeling a bit low on energy and was sulking like a silly squirrel. So, I decided to go to the church and sit there for a while. All I can remember is sitting down; I woke up after an hour and a half, listening to my own snoring. I felt extremely refreshed, although I felt guilty for snoring and disturbing God. Walking back to the presbytery, I thought to myself that was the best prayer time. As soon as I sat in the church, God gave me anaesthesia and silenced me, so He could minister to me. If that sulky silly squirrel had been awake, it would have turned into a pity party of complaining and whining. Our churches should be kept open during the day, for us to fall asleep and be refreshed.
