Peace in the Wounds.

The first encounter between the risen Lord and the disciples must have been filled with profound emotions. Let us place ourselves in the disciples' shoes: relief surged through them at the sight of Jesus' return yet was accompanied by an acute sense of shame for abandoning him during his darkest hour. Fear gripped their hearts, fearing Jesus might scorn them for their disloyalty. Guilt weighed heavily upon them for their betrayal and abandonment. However, despite their defensive and self-condemning sentiments, Jesus' first words to his dejected, fearful, and vulnerable disciples were simply, "peace."

James K Baxter, a NZ poet pens Jesus beautifully,

'Truth' - he said, and - 'Love' - he said, But his purest word was - 'Mercy' -Flowers and candles I bring to him. And no man is kinder than he.

As the Risen Lord reunites with his beloved disciples and mother, his purest word is peace flowing from his merciful heart. In other words, God in Christ Risen proclaims that God is for us, and if God is for us, who can be ever against us? Neither death nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor powers, nor sins, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus or Lord.

As Jesus embraces the disciples, there is no scolding or reprimanding, only pure "peace." This peace speaks of reconciliation, forgiveness, and healing. I vividly recall a moment from my youth when, at the age of sixteen, I went to confession. Overwhelmed by guilt, shame, and self-condemnation echoing in my mind, I broke down during the confession. The priest interrupted me, stepping out of the confessional to embrace me. His words resonated deeply: "God is for you, not against you." Since then, it has become my secret weapon against despondency and the most certain cause for joyful confidence. Pope Francis says, in his book His name is Mercy, "The most important thing in the life of every man and every woman is not that they should never fall along the way, the important thing is always to get back up." We, the followers of Christ, find the energy to get back up from the fountain of God's infinite mercy for us.

Please google the painting "The Incredulity of St. Thomas" by Carravagio. In this artwork, we see how Jesus exposes his wounds to the doubting/hurting disciples and tells them peace. It was the wounding of Jesus that made them scatter, and now they are confronting them, to be healed and to be in peace.

Many of us, myself included, tend to avoid confronting our wounds. The harsh reality is that malevolence exists in the world. We wound each other—parents hurt their children, and vice versa, priests wound their parishioners, and friends hurt each other. However, the risen Lord teaches us that there can be peace within our wounds if we allow God's love to enter through them. Reflecting on the wounds I endured during my childhood and adolescence, I can now boldly assert that those wounds served as the openings through which God entered my life, keeping me grounded and graced.

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday.


